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**A student may simultaneously work on two master's degrees by fulfilling the following requirements:**

To meet the Graduate School minimum requirements for those programs which require 45 graduate hours to complete the degree, a total of 75 hours must be completed: 45 hours for a first master's and 30 hours for a second master's.

To meet the Graduate School minimum requirements for those programs which require more than 45 hours to complete the degree, more than 75 hours shall be required. A review of the student record must clearly show that the degree requirements for each major have been met.

List all course designations for each degree on page two of this form. Remember, courses used for one degree, cannot be used for another degree.

All hours for the second master's must be in residence—no transfer credits from other institutions or from non-matriculant status will be considered.

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### MINIMUM GRADUATE SCHOOL REQUIREMENTS FOR A FIRST MASTER'S DEGREE:

45 Graduate hours (if thesis is submitted, student must have 9 hours of 503 and 36 course hours).

30 hours must be in the student's major.

24 hours must be University of Oregon graded hours with a GPA of at least 3.0.

9 hours must be 600 level courses.

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### MINIMUM GRADUATE SCHOOL REQUIREMENTS FOR A SECOND MASTER'S DEGREE:

3.0 University of Oregon Grade Point Average.

30 hours in the student's second major.

24 hours must be University of Oregon graded hours (if thesis is submitted, student must have 9 hours of 503 and 24 hours of graded credits for a total of 33 hours).

9 hours of 600 level courses.
